Monday 14th July.

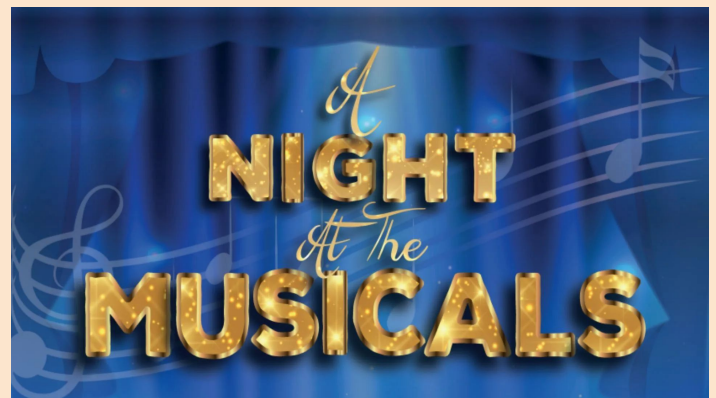


As you may already know, one of our lovely families has recently lost their beautiful boy, Harlow.

Fluttering wings, what a lovely sight!

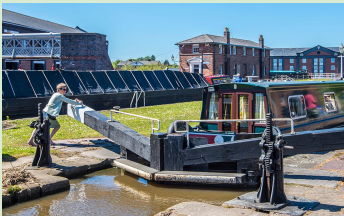
We dug in the garden, planted with care,

Our hearts so full, our smiles so bright!

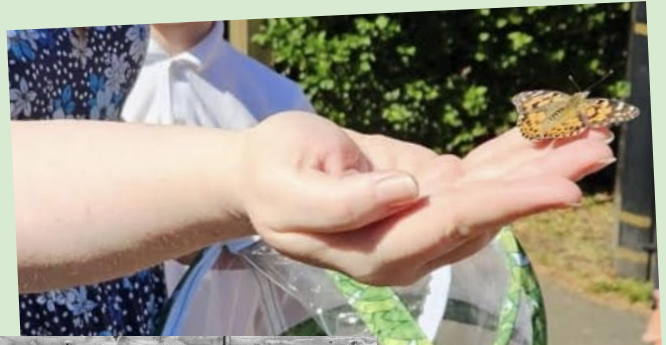
We learned to read, word after word,

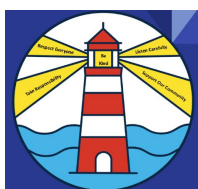

*Remember that school starts at 8:50am and any time after this is late. Formal lessons start at 9:05 and the children need to be in, registered and settled for this time.*



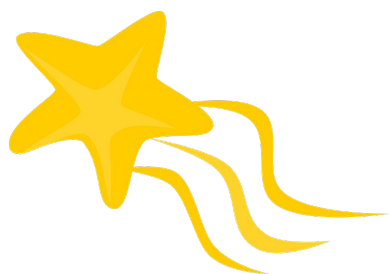
