

Do you know the BIG 5?

Wirral Council's Grey Bin recycling scheme only recycles 5 different types of materials. These are:

Cardboard, Aluminium, Steel, Plastic Bottles and Paper.
These materials have to be clean and dry.

So EVERYTHING else has to go to the collection bins at the Supermarkets or your local Household Recycling Centre.

Believe it or not, everything you put in your Green Bin is either put into landfill or burnt to produce electricity - what a waste!

Wirral recycled only 31.2% in the year to March 2025. This rate is well below the national average for England which is 44%.

- Clatterbridge Mount Road


Opening hours




